TERESITA L. SILVA:
Championing children,
youth and their families



The Saint Teresa of Calcutta Award (STCA) is an annual collaborative project of the AY Foundation, Inc. and the Manila Jaycees. The award aims to honor and recognize selfless individuals who have dedicated at least 25 years of their lives toward helping the poor. This year, the STCA award is given to Teresita L. Silva, a pioneer in the field of child rights in Asia.

Teresita L. Silva is a lifelong advocate for vulnerable families, children in street situations, and female victims of sexual abuse. She has dedicated her life to championing the cause of underprivileged children and families, leading Childhope Philippines as president emeritus and managing board member of several organizations.

Ms. Silva has made significant contributions to the field of child rights, including authoring technical papers on issues faced by children in street situations. Her expertise as a social welfare expert and consultant has been sought after globally, including in Asia and the United States.

The Saint Teresa of Calcutta Award is a testament to Miss Silva's track record of service and dedication to improving the lives of disadvantaged Filipino youth and families. Her personal experiences with poverty, hunger, and adversity have inspired her to create programs to improve their quality of life.



Under Miss Silva's guidance and care, thousands of street children have received education, medical, and psychosocial interventions. She has also extended medical care to 3,000 children in street situation and essential services to 1,500 low-income urban families.

In reflecting on the concept of selflessness, Miss Silva said, "The core of service resides in valuing everyone's worth and prioritizing others' needs over our own... Through service, we enrich both the worlds and ourselves." The Saint Teresa of Calcutta Award brought her deeper into this understanding, highlighting the importance of serving others to create a noteworthy difference in their lives.



The KalyEskwela literally translates to "school on the streets." This part of the program uses a mobile van with audiovisual equipment to conduct alternative education sessions and basic literacy and numeracy classes.



FROM PAVEMENT TO DIPLOMA: The Children who Believed and Overcame

From the streets to universities, for the year 2023, Childhope produced three college graduates. These individuals have defied the odds, and despite the scars of childhood, their hardship and perseverance still persist. They have become an example of what can be done with resilience, consistency, and being relentless to pursue a better future.

Almario, BS Accountancy



Almario, a child of Luneta, was joining Childhope sessions every summer at Luneta Park. All of these stories happened from 2008 to 2009.

Almario was just an observer during the sessions of Street Educators Kuya Jesse and Ate Claire, but because he always participates in the sessions, eventually Almario formally became a part of Ate Claire's session as well.



In 2012, he became actively involved in Childhope as he started returning home to Baseco with his father. He gradually reduced his begging and peddling activities because he became busier with his studies and other engagements at Childhope.

Since high school to college, Childhope has always been there to help him, which is why he finished a Bachelor of Science in Accountancy. Despite encountering challenges along the way, he draws strength from his experiences and uses Childhope as a source of motivation and inspiration.

He is determined to demonstrate that Childhope's assistance didn't get it wrong in helping him. Consequently, he dedicated himself to diligent studies and hard work to successfully complete his college education.

Ross Ann, BS Office Administration



Ross Ann, a young beneficiary from Ospital ng Maynila (OSMA) area has gone through a remarkable journey from her childhood to graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Office Administration. Her life was changed by Childhope, which helps kids who live on the streets.

Through her hard work and their support, Ross Ann's story shows us how education and support can make a big difference in someone's life.



When she was little, she used to go to sessions held by Childhope at a place near Star City. Childhope saw that her family was struggling, so they offered her a chance to become their student. She learned important skills like first aid, staying clean, and knowing her rights. Childhope also helped her become more confident by teaching her to speak in public and be a leader.

Finally, she graduated. Now, as she steps onto the threshold of a new chapter in her life, Ross Ann faces the prospect of choosing a career path that will not only sustain her but also provide for her family. Despite the pressures of uncertainty, her optimism remains unswayed. With numerous job offers on the table, she approaches her decision-making process with a sense of purpose and pragmatism, guided by her unshakable belief that God's plan for her is grander than any obstacle.

Ricky, BS Criminology



Ricky, a dreamer from Divisoria, as a follower and a joiner, he shared that he and his friends were bathing in Ilog Pasig when Childhope arrived for a children's activity. Back then, he was a child in street situation, roaming around Manila to provide for himself in order to eat, doing whatever it takes to make it through the day.

After several sessions, Childhope provided him the opportunity to go back to school.



Ricky didn't miss the chance to grab the opportunity to study, rain or shine; wherever he goes, he always tries his best to focus and accomplish his schoolwork to continue what he started.

With all of these hardships and trials, he finally graduated with a degree of Bachelor of Science in Criminology and is looking forward to continuing his dreams and having a better life out of the streets. He believed that all of the experiences he had were a blessing, as without them, he would never have come as far as where he stands right now



"KAP" is a Filipinized word for the graduation "cap", symbolic of children in street situations' (CiSS) achievements in finishing their education through Childhope's scholarship program.



The Art of Human Support: Helen's Journey Comes Full Circle



Ms. Helen Quinto is one of the foundations that helped Childhope Philippines become what it is today. Her volunteerism and goal to help others led her to become the assistant executive director of the organization. From the beginning until her retirement, Ms. Quinto has continued to shed light for our children in the streets of Manila, helping them to redirect and start their new path.

At the peak of her career, she knows that her job as a social worker doesn't only require her skills but also her time and dedication. After finishing her college degree in 1986 with a Bachelor of Science in Social Work, Ms. Helen started her mission in the social welfare of her province in Zamboanga Del Sur as a volunteer in their municipality. However, despite finishing a degree and being a volunteer, without a license, she knew that it would be difficult to secure a position since their local government only requires 1 social worker per municipality.

With this situation aligning with her husband's re-assignment, they decided to transfer and live in Manila to continue their careers. By this time, Ms. Helen was able to take the licensure exam for social workers in 1995 and passed on her first take, which also led her to her first job with the Children's Growth Center in Quiapo, Manila.

Since then, Ms. Helen has been able to touch and reach out to several children in Manila, allowing her to navigate her path as an individual in the field of social work. Despite the continuous operations, unfortunately, the Children's Growth Center had to stop their operations by that time, which led her to join and be referred to Childhope Philippines in April 1998 as a social worker and street educator, which allowed her to continue her mission.

During her time as a social worker on Childhope, she mentioned that one of her unforgettable moments was when the children in her session helped her find the home of a kid who collapsed while she was on service.

She shared that during that time, she was worried and clueless about what could happen, but luckily, with the guidance of the Lord, the children in her session got her back and knew where to find the kid's home. With the unfamiliarity of the location, her students guided her and gave her the reassurance that she would be okay and that they would stay with her no matter what.

From then on, she knew that these children could make and be the change, which gave her living proof with one of our 2023 graduates, Ricky. She shared that Ricky was remarkable to her since she witnessed his growth. She remembered seeing him since she was starting her work back at the Children's Growth Center as a child of the streets and was surprised to see that he's one of the beneficiaries of Childhope, which allowed him to take a Bachelor of Science in Criminology.

Over two decades, Ms. Helen had dedicated her life to helping others, bearing witness to countless triumphs and tragedies, and fighting tirelessly to make a difference in the lives of those who needed it most. From navigating the streets of Manila to advocating for the children and families within, she left an indelible mark on her profession and the lives she touched. She had been a rock for families torn apart by crisis, a safe haven for children fleeing abuse, and a champion for those who had been silenced by systemic oppression. Her sessions had been a sanctuary, a place where tears were shed, hugs were shared, and hopes were kindled.

She never asked for an exchange of means; she only wishes that the individuals who she helped may also do the same for those who are struggling to find their way, as she knew that this impact would last forever and will serve as a testament to the continuous mission of helping one child at a time. The weight of her experiences, the depth of her compassion, and the breadth of her love would all be distilled into the memories of those who had been touched by her work and would continue to inspire generations to come.



KalyenDeria Mobile Soup Kitchen: Addressing nutritional needs of CiSS

Childhope's programs and projects are holistic to promote the welfare, uphold, and protect children's rights. With this, children are supported through Childhope's education, psychosocial interventions, and health and medical services.

Nutrition is no exception to children's rights. Thus, Childhope established KalyenDeria in 2021 in response to the pandemic to distribute filling meals to children in street situations aside from the relief assistance they provided during the COVID-19 lockdown.

KalyenDeria is a mobile kitchen that travels around Manila to distribute meals to Childhope's beneficiaries. Meal distributions happen 3-4 times weekly from Tuesday to Thursday and sometimes on Saturdays. 400 meals are distributed on the according days, amounting to 1,200-1,600 given meals each week to areas from the northern and southern parts of Manila.

For meal preparation, the personnel of Childhope start preparing and cooking the meals for KalyenDeria before lunch so that the kids will receive their warm meals by lunchtime. However, the time slot has been adjusted recently due to the sweltering heat index and to distribute meals after the children's school dismissal.

For that reason, the mini trucks are stocked and ready to travel to the designated areas between 3 and 4 in the afternoon instead of the initial lunchtime schedule.

During the KalyenDeria distribution, there are parent and youth leaders who assist in distributing meals. They also act as contact person/s for every area to gather the kids and ensure the distribution will go smoothly.

Thanks to donations, sponsors, and most especially GT Foundation, KalyenDeria has been helping children in street situations since 2021.



We at Childhope Philippines recently launched our newest program, Kalyenderia Mobile Soup Kitchen, with the main goal of sharing nutritious food with less-fortunate beneficiaries, especially street children.

Kalyenderia aims to address and alleviate hunger by providing hot meals and hot soups to street families in Manila.

With this initiative, alongside with our other efforts, we yearn to provide holistic development for the Filipino street children and to eventually give them the better life that they deserve.



Healthy Future: KliniKalye's Commitment to Healthcare

In 2023, the KliniKalye Mobile Health Clinic Project exceeded its annual target by providing 1,119 medical consultations to vulnerable individuals. A significant 74% of these consultations were conducted in-person during area visits, with beneficiaries also able to request consultations through social workers or chat directly with physicians through the Childhope Philippines Teleconsultations Facebook page. The project's services included medical consultations, physical examinations, wound care, and provision of complete medicines, multivitamins, and medical supplies.

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The project's consultations accounted for only 16.8% of the total consultations, focusing on prevention of illnesses and injuries through proper hygiene, road safety, and mask-wearing. Nutritional monitoring revealed that 76% of beneficiaries had normal BMI-for-height, while 64% had normal height-for-age. Additionally, 84 beneficiaries received additional assistance for diagnostic procedures, dental procedures, referrals to hospitals or specialists, and corrective eyeglasses.



The project also conducted some health education activities, including teaching sessions on health promotion and disease prevention by third-year medical students from the Ateneo School of Medicine and Public Health. The University of the Philippines Regionalization Students Organization also conducted first aid training as part of their medical mission. Moreover, the project provided online and face-to-face medical check-ups for other indigent individuals and occupational health services for Childhope employees.

Despite challenges posed by weather disturbances and difficulties in contacting patients, the project continued to provide medical assistance through telemedicine. To address these challenges, the project solicited help from parent leaders during phone calls to ensure more patients could undergo check-ups despite connectivity issues.

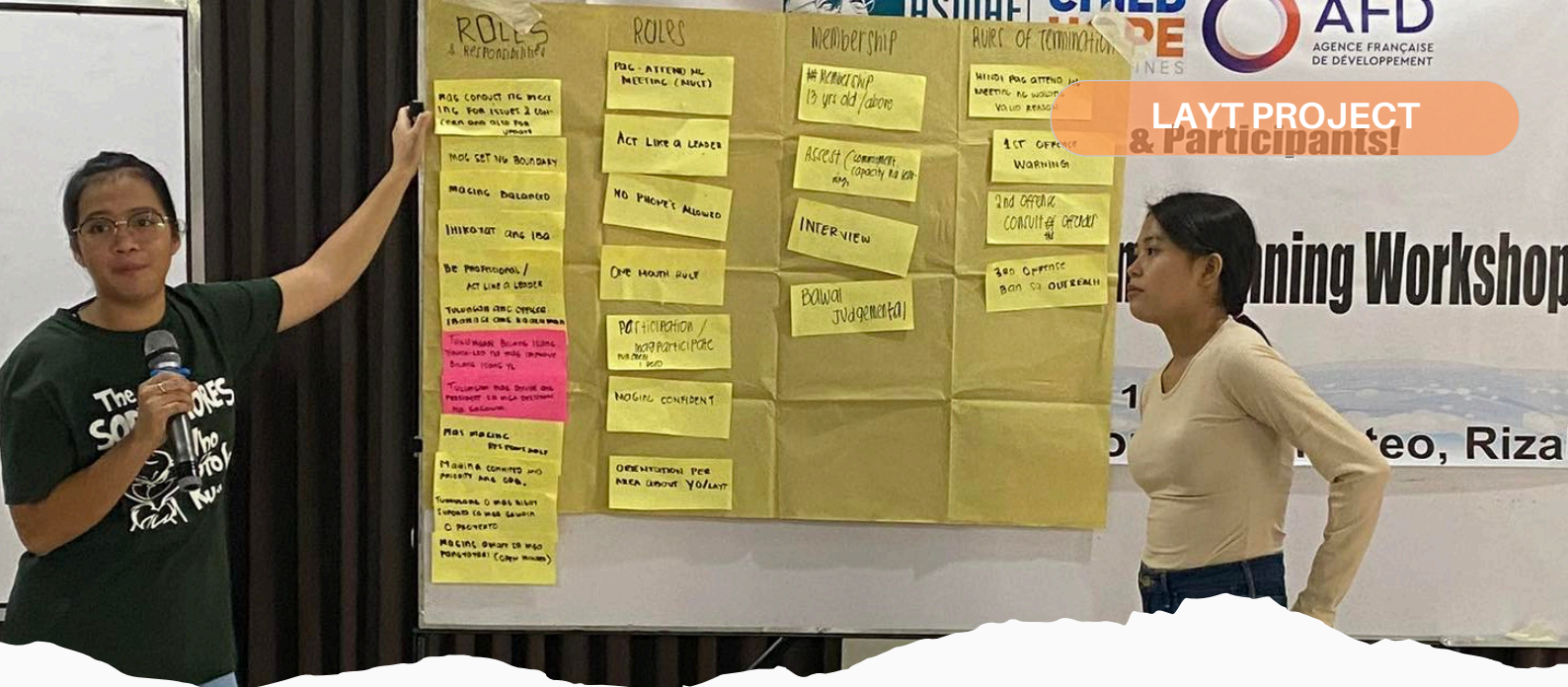
Lessons learned from the project implementation highlight the importance of working with different sectors to address health problems of vulnerable groups. The project's success was also attributed to the collaboration with various stakeholders, including academics, health volunteers, and government entities.

With this journey, the KliniKalye Mobile Health Clinic is excited to announce its new partnership with Avant Healthcare Professionals, the premier recruiting and staffing specialist for internationally educated healthcare professionals. This partnership aims to further enhance the project's services by providing access to specialized medical expertise and to help our beneficiaries more when it comes to their health and even to building their profession. With Avant Healthcare Professionals' support, the project will be able to expand its reach to even more vulnerable communities and provide more comprehensive healthcare services to those in need.



KliniKalye, offers primary preventative medical care, consultations, and treatments. Their Mobile Health Clinic guarantees that the children are healthy and able to thrive. Every week, KliniKalye provides medical treatment to hundreds of street children in Metro Manila's poorest neighborhoods.

Childhope Philippines' Mobile Health Clinic diagnoses medical conditions and gives appropriate and tailored medical management through vitamin and mineral supplements; wound care and minor surgical procedures; nutritional status monitoring; routine deworming; and health checkups.



The LAYT Project: Building Leaders, Building Communities

The LAYT Project, a youth organization comprising 32 Childhope beneficiaries from six areas in the Philippines, is driven by the active involvement of its officers, area leaders, and members, who shape activities and sessions tailored to their community's unique needs. Established in 2021, the project was formed by merging the Junior Child's Rights Advocate (JCRA) and Junior Health Workers (JHW) initiatives, with elected officers, area leaders, and members taking their respective roles in 2022, aiming to empower young people and foster leadership and collaboration within them.

Ms. Mari Mar Mangilaya-Luna plays a crucial role in guiding the young members of the LAYT Project through various training sessions and activities. She serves as a mentor, helping the youth develop the skills required to respond to the particular needs of their projects. Under her guidance, the members of the LAYT Project work together to devise strategies to engage with their respective barangays effectively, ensuring that their activities align with the needs and aspirations of the community.

Through the LAYT Project, Childhope PH aims to empower young people with leadership skills and enhance their facilitation abilities, enabling them to promote meaningful dialogue and spark change in their communities.

Stories of our Beacons of Hope

In May 2023, we were proud to award these three amazing women for their devotion and loyalty to our children. Being the guidance, leading individuals through treacherous waters of uncertainty and despair and towards a brighter future.



Dr. Isabel Aleta made a commitment to volunteerism to pursue her strong sense of social responsibility.

In the year 2001, Dr. Bel began to aid children who were living on the streets in Metro Manila. She accomplished this by introducing Childhope PH to the UN Women's Group (UNWG), a non-profit group of volunteers associated with the UN that is dedicated to supporting women and children facing challenging circumstances all over the world. For more than two decades, Dr. Bel actively raised funds to support the Street Education and Protection Program, with a specific emphasis on educational assistance.

She continued her volunteerism by extending herself to those who were in need. In Pampanga, she helped to aid the farmers and their children from different cases of health conditions, and as she continued her legacy with her family, they also helped over 30 students graduate from college, which transformed these individuals and families' lives.



Ms. Jackie Chua has been an ardent supporter and valiant champion of the urban poor and children in street situation residing in the Binondo and Divisoria areas. Ms. Jackie is particularly famous for her distinctive Grasya Clap and her unwavering dedication to catering to the needs of these vulnerable children and their families through consistent fundraising and outreach initiatives.



In 2007, she first became affiliated with Childhope. During an outreach program arranged by her and her friends, she brought joy and amusement to children in street situation. Her lively, faith-centered, and humorous way of interacting with these children and their families earned her a spot among our most cherished donors and supporters. Events led by Ms. Chua are always highly anticipated and enjoyed.



Ms. Jackie's philanthropic endeavors extend beyond Childhope PH, as she also provides aid to the Philippine Jesuit Prison Service, Anawim Lay Missions Foundation, and the Correctional Institute for Women. Her outreach efforts truly make a difference in the lives of those who have been abandoned or forgotten by society, as they show that there are individuals who care and prioritize their well-being.



Ms. Zena Bernardo has overseen various programs related to education and healthcare for women and children. She has worked in administrative as well as program operations capacities, making a difference through organizations like the Natasha Goulbourn Foundation, Operation Smile Philippines, Ladies Who Launch, Bayanihang Marikenyo at Marikenya, The Community Kitchen, and most recently, Project Hulmahan, an art-driven mutual aid advocacy in support of livelihood, food security, and disaster response.

In 2008, Ms. Bernardo joined Childhope Philippines and took charge of mobilizing resources and fostering partnerships with local and international donors and stakeholders. She proved to be an exceptional fundraiser and an ardent champion of children's rights and well-being. Her efforts were pivotal in establishing connections with various individuals, groups, and organizations that endorsed the organization's goals.

Her heart remained dedicated to the children even after her departure from Childhope PH. Her assistance extended beyond just providing mutual aid, as she sought to empower both the children and their families.

#iGiveHope Community

Through our #iGiveHope Community, we empower street children by providing interaction with diverse groups, boosting self-confidence, and sharing stories that motivate them to finish their educations through different outreach activities such as art sessions, team building activities, leadership training, and among activities. This tool helps break the cycle of poverty, molding the children into respectful, useful, and responsible members of society.



Outreach Activities: A Year of Impact and Gratitude

For the year 2023, we have successfully had **157** outreach activities across Manila, having **4,853** volunteers who managed, helped and reached out, gathering **13,550** hours total of volunteer work.

These outreach activities from January 2023 - December 2023 were a series of events from feeding programs, seminars and workshops for our beneficiaries, learning sessions, team building such as the sports fest, and even birthday parties together with our ambassadors.

These activities will not be possible without our partners who have demonstrated their commitment to our cause through their volunteer efforts, fundraising initiatives, and generous donations.

These activities not only brought smiles to the children's faces but also taught them the value of life, helped develop their skills, and boosted their confidence. Moreover, they made the children feel that they were still valued members of society, despite their circumstances.

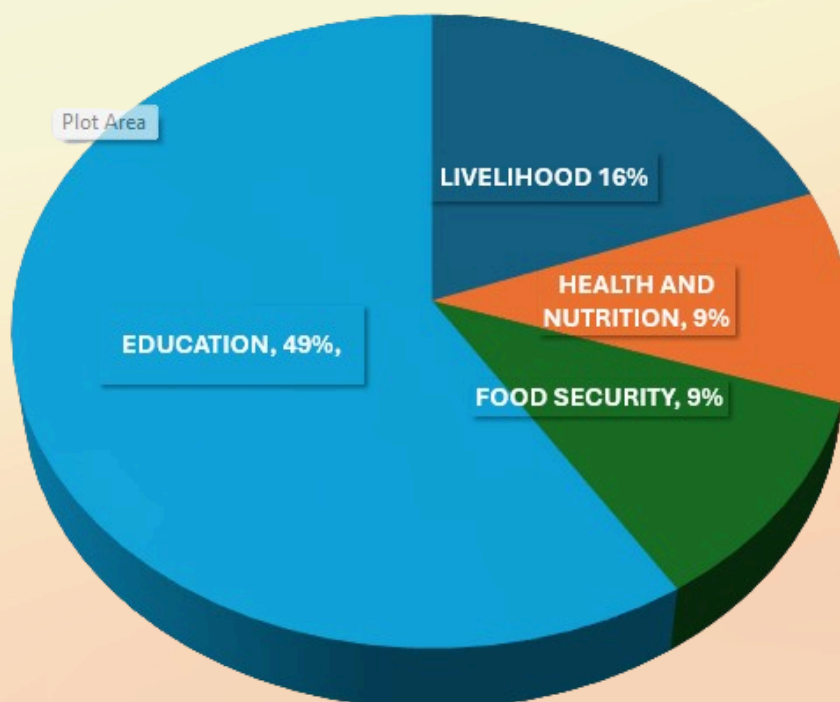
